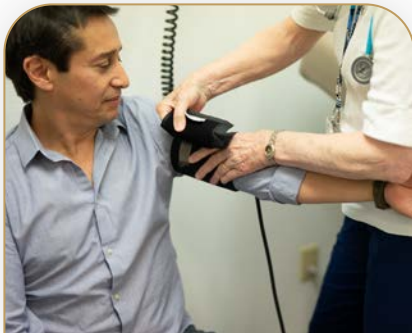




Access to Resources

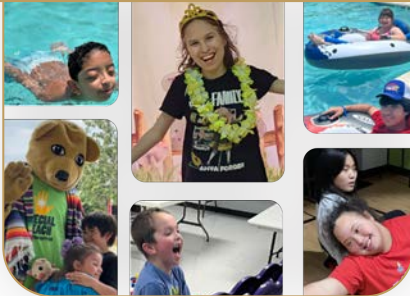
